

Our church Harvest is later this week as I Write this and again the Foodbank and Bishop's Harvest Appeal will be supported. Harvest is a time to be thankful for what we have – not just the food on the table but all the blessing we receive throughout the year.



## WEBSTER'S WAFFLE

One thing you notice when you read about Jesus is that he was compassionate. It's one of the things about him that keeps cropping up. So in Matthew 9 we read, "When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." In Matthew, before the feeding of the five thousand we read, "And Jesus went forth, and saw a great multitude, and was moved with compassion toward them, and he healed their sick." Apparently in the 33 miracles of Jesus, in at least six, it's specifically mentioned that Jesus had compassion on the person he was with. Be they a leper, a widow whose son had died, or a person possessed by demons, it was Jesus's compassion which drove him.

Indeed if you read Paul in his letter to the Colossians, Compassion is one of the things that defines a Christian. "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."

This is in chapter 3 of Colossians. It's often overlooked because it follows the bit where Paul tells people to (in the words of the King James) 'Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence, and covetousness, which is idolatry.' Admit it, if you've got to preach on Colossians it's far more fun to get stuck into that, pounding the pulpit and demanding your congregation give up on their fornication and inordinate affection than it is to suggest they might just try being nice to each other. It's the same with the latter half of Chapter 3 of Colossians. This is the bit about keeping order in households and everybody submitting. It allows people to be controversial and be the centre of attention. This means that the important bit, the bit that is really difficulty, that means you have to get out there and put in the effort, they can somehow overlook.

When you look at the list, compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; compassion is the source of them all. If you have compassion, then kindness, gentleness and patience come more easily. Humility is harder to link to compassion, but look at its opposite, pride. In Proverbs 16 it says, 'Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall.' Or as Jesus said in Luke 14, "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Pride struts and preens, telling the world how important it is. Pride hasn't time to help others, except incidentally if it makes the proud look better. Humility listens. Thus with patience and kindness, gently it can reach out with compassion.

Now it's important to remember that we're talking about compassion, not just sympathy. Somebody once said to me, 'Sympathy sends a card, Compassion turns up in person bringing cake.' I don't know whether this is theologically exact, but compassion isn't compassion unless it does something.
